### SITUATION

The Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant Program is a competitive grant awarded by the South Carolina Office of Attorney General (SCAG) with U.S. Department of Justice funds. The Solicitor's Office has been awarded this grant for the past eleven years. This award is therefore a continuation of a previously awarded grant.

The Solicitor's Office is requesting to accept the VAWA grant to fund one Prosecutor in the amount of \$76,672 with an in-kind match of 25,557. The grant period will run from October 1, 2020 until September 30, 2021. There is 1.0 grant-funded FTE associated with this request. The match associated with this grant is in-kind and therefore does not cause an expense to the Solicitor's Office nor to the County.

It is understood that at the conclusion of the grant period, the FTE will be dissolved if no further grant funding is available.

The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Program Grant is a competitive grant awarded by the South Carolina Office of Attorney General (SCAG) with U.S. Department of Justice funds. The Solicitor's Office has been awarded the VOCA grant for the last eleven years. In this VOCA application, our office applied to continue 8 full-time advocates to serve both Charleston and Berkeley counties.

The Solicitor's Office is requesting to use the \$482,991 award to fund 8 Victim Advocates, which includes an in-kind salary match in the amount of \$120,748; the in-kind match will be provided by other victim advocates employed by our office.

The grant period will run from October 1, 2020 until September 30, 2021. There are 8 grant-funded FTEs associated with this request. The match associated with this grant is in-kind and therefore does not cause an expense to the Solicitor's Office or to the County.

It is understood that at the conclusion of the grant period, the FTEs will be dissolved if no further grant funding is available.

### SITUATION

The Library requests approval to accept, if awarded, funding in an amount up to \$100,000 for the WISE (Women in the Southeast) Telehealth Network. This grant, the Rural Innovations Cooperative Agreement Program, is funded by the South Carolina Center for Rural and Primary Healthcare. The grant project is in partnership with the College of Charleston, Medical University of South Carolina and the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC).

- Dr. Angela Dempsey, Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC), Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Associate Dean for Curriculum, Clinical Sciences, Director, Ryan Residency Training Program, *Principal Investigator*
- Dr. Constance Guille, Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC), Associate Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, Founder, Women's Reproductive Behavioral Health Program

   Center for Telehealth, Associate Professor, Academic Affairs Faculty

The COVID-19 pandemic increased healthcare disparities among women, including delayed or cancelled appointments, and difficulty accessing health services. These health disparities are exacerbated for women living in rural locations. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) encourages the use of telehealth to expand services for rural women. The purpose of the WISE (women in the southeast) Telehealth Network is to improve women's health and well-being by providing preventive care through telehealth at local libraries. WISE will serve women in the rural Lowcountry at the Edisto Island Library, McClellanville Library, St. Paul's/Hollywood Library, and the Mobile Library, Formative audience research, including in-depth interviews with 52 women in the rural lowcountry found that women wanted private, confidential telehealth services at an established, neutral, community location - a public library! This needs assessment found that women consider their health holistically when making choices about reproductive health. As a result, this initiative will address persistent disparities in women's health through a "life course" perspective to health promotion and disease prevention. WISE will connect women to healthcare resources and care management in the areas of maternal care, infectious disease, and mental health. The CCPL system will provide a means of community engagement by connecting community members with healthcare resources. A community health worker will provide health education and connect women to available community and social services, as well as serve as a telepreceptor for the direct provision of preventive care through telehealth appointments with MUSC faculty. WISE will also partner with DHEC to provide low-cost referrals for in-person services. On-going and longitudinal evaluation research will monitor progress and opportunities to meet women's needs. The overall goal of WISE is to develop a sustainable system that can be adopted by other rural libraries, easily scaled, and informs telehealth policy.



### SITUATION

On July 24, 2018, County Council adopted ZLDR Article 6.8, Short-Term Rentals, which regulated short-term rentals for the first time, and amended the County Fee Ordinance to incorporate fees for Short-Term Rental Zoning Permits. Since the adoption of the Short-Term Rental Regulations (STR) Ordinance, the County has hired a code enforcement officer dedicated solely to enforcing it and has purchased software that tracks short-term rental advertisements and identifies their addresses, which allows staff to identify whether or not they are operating in violation of the STR Ordinance. After almost two years of implementing and enforcing the STR Ordinance, staff has identified several matters that need to be clarified or changed, which are being addressed through amendments to the STR Ordinance. In addition, the cost of administering and enforcing the STR Ordinance is far higher than envisioned when the Fee Ordinance was amended to include Short-Term Rental Zoning Permit Fees in 2018; therefore, increases in those fees are being proposed.

### **ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL**

Approve the proposed amendments to the Fee Ordinance recommended by the Planning Commission (see attached).

### DEPARTMENT HEAD'S RECOMMENDATION

Amend the Fee Ordinance to increase Short-Term Rental Zoning Permit fees as recommended by the Planning Commission.

*Notes (for general information – not to be included in the Fee Ordinance):* 

- When all zoning related application and permit fees are included, the EHR Short-Term Rental Permit zoning permit fees total \$700 (\$200 zoning permit fee + \$250 Site Plan Review application fee + \$250 Special Exception application fee).
- When all zoning related application and permit fees are included, the CGH Short-Term Rental zoning permit fees total \$550 \$800 (\$300 zoning permit fee + \$250 \$500 Site Plan Review application fee). In addition, commercial assessment would apply.

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THOSE PORTIONS OF CHAPTER 2 / ARTICLE V / DIVISION 2 / SECTION 2 - 137 DEALING WITH FEES TO AMEND THE SHORT-TERM RENTAL ZONING PERMIT APPLICATION FEES

### Section 1.0 - Purpose of Amendment, Finding

WHEREAS, County Council has adopted Short-Term Rental regulations on July 24, 2018, and

WHEREAS, the cost to administer the Short-Term Rental regulations, including purchasing software and adding additional staff, has identified a need to increase the fees associated with Short-Term Rental Zoning Permit Applications, and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission has reviewed the proposed fees and unanimously recommended approval at their July 13 and August 10, 2020 meetings, and

**WHEREAS**, Council finds that fees for these applications should be increased in the County's Fee Schedule.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by Charleston County Council, in meeting duly assembled, as follows:

### Section 2.0 - Text Change:

The pertinent portions of Section 2 - 137 of the Charleston County Code of Ordinances entitled "Schedule established" are hereby amended as follows:

County Council hereby establishes the fees of the below-listed services and authorizes the specified fee amounts by the appropriate department of the County government prior to the service being performed:

- 1. Zoning and Planning Department
  - a. Short-Term Rental Zoning Permit Applications.

Zoning Permits for VHRs will not be issued until/unless the Site Plan Review application is approved and the Board of Zoning Appeals approves the Special Exception application.

Short-Term Rental Permit: Commercial Guest House (CGH) Note that in addition to the CGH Zoning Permit application and fee, a Site Plan Review application (with the required fee) must be submitted pursuant to the requirements and processes contained in the ZLDR. Zoning Permits for CHRs will not be issued until/unless the Site Plan Review application is approved.	\$300.00

### Section 3.0 – Severability

If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any circumstance is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, this holding does not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

### Section 4.0 - Effective dates; severability

This ordinance shall be effective immediately following approval at third reading. The changes in the Administrative code shall be effective as of approval of third reading.
