The Genesis Project

The Genesis Project was established after the tragic drowning of a 13 year-old boy in Hollywood, SC named Genesis Holmes. The project aims to raise funds to provide swim and water safety programs in rural areas of Charleston County.



The Genesis Project – The Portable Pool Program

- established in 2013
 - rotates between:
 - 3 CCPRC Community Recreation Camps and
 - Edisto Community (Jane Edwards Elementary);
 - the McClellanville Community; and
 - Johns Island Community.
- Each camper receives 8 lessons in 2 weeks.
- Typically serve 400 children annually.





Did you know?


It takes approximately a week for breakdown, transport, assembly, filling and inspections. The portable pool is divided into three lanes with each having an instructor and up to six swimmers.

West County Aquatic Center – Hollywood, SC









- So far this summer,
 - over 150 swim lessons have been taught; and
 - over 3,500 facility visitors.
- During a typical summer, CCPRC would also transport campers from the Hollywood/Ravenel, Johns Island and Awendaw/McClellanville Communities to WCAC for lessons and swimming.
- Open May Labor Day
- \$2 per person, \$25 Season Pass, 4 Admissions with CCPRC Gold Pass






Amenities include:
