SITUATION

The Charleston County Coroner's Office is requesting permission to apply for the FY2020 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program. This grant program provides funds to improve forensic science and medical examiner/coroner services.

The Coroner's Office is requesting \$55,000 to continue funding a forensic autopsy technician FTE from a prior Coverdell grant and to purchase supplies needed in the autopsy room to improve the quality and timeliness of services. Supplies to be purchased include personal protective equipment (PPE) specific for the autopsy room environment.

There is a no match with this federal program.

There is one grant funded FTE associated with this request. The grant period runs from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

SITUATION

The Ernest F. Kennedy Center is a private, non-profit organization based in Moncks Corner, SC, which is designated as a county substance abuse provider by the South Carolina Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Service (SC DAODAS).

The Kennedy Center is partnering with the Charleston County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) to reduce underage drinking and underage smoking. CCSO is the lead agency for the Ninth Judicial Circuit's Alcohol Enforcement Team Grant. This funding is a sub-award from the federal Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP) block grant prevention funds. The CCSO has been sub-awarded \$6,000 of these funds to use for the enforcement of underage drinking and smoking laws.

The funds were remitted to the CCSO on June 29, 2020, were available for expenditure as of that date, and have no stated expiration date.

There are no FTE's requested in this funding and no match is required.

SHERIFF'S RECOMMENDATION

SITUATION

In 2018, the City of North Charleston requested permission to co-locate a single engine company for their Fire Department at the Charleston County-owned Medic Station #15, located at 9425 Highway 78 in Ladson. This relocation requires a small building addition and interior renovations that the City of North Charleston will fully fund (estimated at \$600,000). On June 5, 2018, County Council approved the acceptance of project funds from the City of North Charleston and a ten (10) year lease for \$1 per year (see attached directive 18-150). County Staff subsequently drafted an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) reflecting the approved terms, but the agreement was not signed. Per guidance from both Councils, funds would not transfer without an executed IGA and work would not start without funds on hand. In September of 2020, the City of North Charleston requested a longer lease term specifically revising the base lease term from 10 years to 25 years and further requesting a 25 year extension option (See attached letter from the City of North Charleston).

ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL

Approve Department Head recommendation to modify the base lease.

DEPARTMENT HEAD'S RECOMMENDATION

- Authorize County staff to modify the base lease term contained in Council Directive 18-150 by extending the lease term from ten (10) years to twenty five (25) years and by adding a twenty five (25) year extension option for the use of Medic Station #15, located at 9425 Highway 78 in Ladson, for the City of North Charleston's Fire Department.
- All documents to be reviewed by the Legal Department.

Dear Chairman Summey:

Per our discussion concerning the joint use of the property at 9425 Highway 78, commonly known as EMS Medic #15, the City hearby request that the lease terms of the existing agreement be changed to 25 years with a 25 year option. This will ensure that we have continuity of fire protection service in the area and are able to justify the capital investment in the property. City Council has already approved the expenditure of \$600,000. We would like to see these funds put to use within the next 6-months to satisfy our bond sale requirments. A copy of the revised lease agreement and design schematic is included. Please let me know if there are any concerns.

Changes to the agreement include the following:

1) Removed reference to any indemnification clauses per state law.

2) Changed the term to 25 years with a 25 year option.

3) Removed some minor boilerplate language which may be unsuitable for a fire station.

4) Changed language in Termination Section from 60 to 365 days due to the difficulty in relocating a fire station.

SITUATION

Pursuant to Council Directive 19-370, Council voted to authorize Navy Hospital Partners, LLC to design and construct an approximate 165,000 sf Social Services HUB building near 3600 River Ave. The Master Site Plan for the development of the Social Services HUB will include a parcel of land identified as 3525 Pinehaven Drive, further identified as TMS # 469-06-00-005 (Parcel 3A), that is currently owned by the South Carolina Department of Transportation ("SCDOT").

The current deed to the property located at 3525 Pinehaven Drive will automatically revert back to Charleston County if SCDOT ceases to occupy the premises for SCDOT operations. In order to invoke the reverted clause of the deed, the County proposes to enter into a lease agreement with SCDOT to relocate them to a 8,496 sq. ft. space on County owned property located at 1357 Remount Road in North Charleston.

SCDOT has expressed its willingness to relocate its operations on Pinehaven Drive in exchange for a long term lease for a portion of Unit 1 at 1357 Remount Road.

Terms of the lease include a ten (10) year term, with two (2) options to renew, the first option to renew being an additional ten (10) year term, the second option to renew being an additional five (5) year term, unless the lease agreement is terminated or amended by either SCDOT or the County. Rent shall be one (\$1) dollar per year. Operational maintenance, repairs and alteration expenses shall be paid for in accordance with exhibit B.

Authorize the lease of a 8,496 sq. ft. suite which is a portion of Unit 1 at 1357 Remount Road to SCDOT for a ten (10) year term, with two (2) options to renew, the first option to renew being an additional ten (10) year term, the second option to renew being an additional five (5) year term, unless the lease agreement is terminated or amended by either SCDOT or the County. Rent shall be one (\$1) dollar per year.





SITUATION

As part of the 2016 Transportation Sales Tax Program there are multiple featured projects that provide both local and regional benefits to our transportation system. As staff works with our consultants to design the projects, efforts are made to avoid and/or minimize the impacts to the environment. However it has become apparent that several of the projects will impact saltwater wetlands and therefore the County will be required to purchase credits to mitigate those impacts.

Staff and our consultants have worked together to estimate the impacts of our projects and develop a mitigation strategy that satisfies the permitting requirements, fits well within our program and benefits our community. Through that process, the team identified Point Farm Mitigation Bank as the most desirable opportunity to satisfy our needs while restoring 60 acres of wetlands and forever protecting over 1,300 acres of salt marsh lands. Point Farm is proposed to be the largest salt marsh restoration project of this type in South Carolina and is located on Wadmalaw Island. The bank will improve water quality, lessen the effects of flooding and sea level rise, and provide environmental improvements that offset the impacts of several critical road construction projects. Point Farm will be available for local public education opportunities and be a resource for universities as a research site for a wide array of ecological and climate change studies.

ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL

Authorize staff to enter into an agreement with Point Farm Salt Marsh Mitigation Bank.

DEPARTMENT HEAD RECOMMENDATION

Authorize staff to enter into an agreement with Point Farm Salt Marsh Mitigation Bank to purchase and reserve mitigation credits to offset impacts associated with transportation improvement projects.
