The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program is a direct allocation grant funding program which must be used only for criminal justice initiatives. The Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) calculates the yearly award amount based on a formula of crime statistics and population. Based on this formula, the allocation for Charleston County for 2020 will be \$24,621.00. The Sheriff's Office will receive \$16,006 and the remaining \$8,615.00 will be allocated to the Solicitor's Office.

The Sheriff's Office is requesting to use this award for body armor vests for Charleston County Sheriff's Office Patrol Deputies for safety and functionality. The grant period will run from October 1, 2020 until September 30, 2021. There are no FTEs requested in this grant. No match is required.

According to the JAG program statute, a "disparity" may exist between the funding eligibility of a county and its associated municipalities. Reference: 34 U.S.C. § 10156(d)(4). Because of the County's disparate jurisdiction status with North Charleston and in accordance with JAG regulation, the County will file a joint application with the City of North Charleston whereby the City serves as the fiscal agent for the award.

ACTION REQUESTED OF COUNCIL

Approve Sheriff's recommendation to apply for and accept if awarded, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance (JAG) Grant.

SHERIFF'S RECOMMENDATION

- Allow the Sheriff's Office to apply for and accept if awarded, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance (JAG) Grant Program through the U.S. Department of Justice to purchase armor vests. Based on formula, the allocation for Charleston County will be \$24,621. The funds will be distributed as \$16,006 to the Charleston County Sheriff's Office, and \$8,615 to the 9th Circuit Solicitor's Office.
- The grant period will run from October 1, 2020 until September 30, 2021.
- There are no FTEs requested in this grant and no match is required.

The Building Inspection Services Department requests approval to apply for, and accept if awarded, federal funding in an amount up to \$549,567.30 (75% of total estimate of \$732,756.41) for the Woodland Shores Flood Mitigation Project. This grant is provided by the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources, under FEMA's Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA). Funding would be used to obtain a consultant to create design documents based on the Davis and Floyd's Study for bid and construction. The Woodland Shores area was selected due to drainage issues and repetitive losses in that area.

There is a 25% match requirement for this grant, which will be met in-kind via staff time. No additional money or FTEs will be required to carry out this request. The grant performance period is 36 months from the date of award.







In accordance with Council Directive 20-47, at a meeting of County Council on March 10, 2020, Council voted to authorize staff to negotiate with MB Kahn to renovate the five (5) regional libraries pursuant to the terms discussed in Executive Session, with the understanding that staff will bring back a recommendation to Council for consideration and approval.

Negotiations with MB Kahn have concluded and staff recommends award of a Contract Amendment to MB Kahn for the renovation of the Five Regional Libraries (Otranto, Cynthia Hurd, Johns Island, Mt Pleasant and Dorchester) for the firm fixed price of \$8,785,068.00. The renovation at the first three Libraries (as determined by the CCPL) will commence no later than October 1, 2020 and attain Substantial Completion 8 months later. Renovation of the remaining two Libraries will commence after the completion of the first three and attain Substantial Completion 8 months later. Renovation 5 months later Substantial Completion 8 months later and attain Substantial Completion 8 months from their notice to proceed.

The negotiated price is within the Current Working Estimate of the Five Regional Libraries as part of the overall Library Referendum project.
