AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-21 FOR THE TOWN OF EDISTO BEACH, SOUTH CAROLINA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2020 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2021

WHEREAS, Subsection 3 of Section 5-7-260 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, as amended, requires that municipal council shall act by ordinance to levy taxes and adopt a budget pursuant to public notice;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Town of Edisto Beach, in Council duly assembled, and by the authority of the same, that the following provisions are hereby adopted and enacted:

Section 1. The prepared budget and estimated revenues for the payment of the same totaling \$7,686,245 with the revenues equaling expenditures is hereby adopted and made a part of hereof as if fully incorporated herein and a copy therefore dated June 1, 2020, is attached hereto.

Section 2. The tax levy for the Town of Edisto Beach Fiscal Year 2020/2021 shall be 24.07 mills.

Section 3. All other appropriations are adopted thereof.

Section 4. The billing dates, penalty dates and amount of penalty which shall be levied for delinquent taxes shall be as follows:

Taxes are due from the 30th day of September through the 15th day of January. Taxes are delinquent on the 16th day of January with a 3% penalty added, on the 2nd day of February another 7% penalty added, and on the 17th day of March another 5% added.

Pursuant to the contract for the tax year of 1986, the Town of Edisto Beach appoints the Colleton County Treasurer as its agent for collection of taxes and penalties.

Section 5. Nothing herein shall prohibit the Town Council to authorize the transfer of appropriated funds from line item to line item within the General Fund, Water Fund, Sewer Fund or Civic Center Fund as necessary to achieve the goal of the budget. Amendments to the budget may be enacted by resolution of Town Council as it deems necessary and appropriate. The Town Administrator may authorize the transfer of appropriated funds not to exceed \$2,000 within departments as necessary to achieve the goal of the budget.

Section 6. If, for any reason any sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be declared invalid, such shall not affect the remaining portions thereof.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon approval by Town Council.

1. Section 66-8(c) is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 66-8. Fees.

(c) The fee structure for residential or nonresidential property owners within the Town is as follows:

	Fee
All residential property owners (first container).....	\$299.00
Each additional container.....	\$179.00

The fees are billed semiannually in advance at a rate of \$149.50 for the first container and \$89.50 for each additional container.

**TOWN OF EDISTO BEACH
AN ORDINANCE
TO AMEND SECTION 78-36 OF THE TOWN'S CODE TO ADJUST THE
PENALTY FOR PARKING VIOLATIONS**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Edisto Beach, South Carolina, in Council duly assembled that Section 78-36 of the Town's Code be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 78-32. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Operator means and includes every person who shall operate, drive or be in control of any vehicle upon any street.

Park means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading.

Vehicle means and includes every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway. A bicycle, 4-wheel pedaled vehicle, motorized skateboard, mo-ped, motor scooter, motor bicycle, motorcycle, and golf cart shall be termed a 'vehicle'.

Sec. 78-33. - Parking prohibited.

- (a) Each of the following streets or portions of streets lying within the town shall constitute a no parking zone:
- (1) Intersection at Baynard Street Beach Access.
 - (2) 410 feet west on Jungle Road beginning at Highway 174 intersection.
- (b) The council may create, add to, change or eliminate any no parking zone by resolution.
- (c) No person shall cause, allow or permit any vehicle registered in his name or any vehicle controlled or operated by him to park within a no parking zone, except a service vehicle operator actively engaged in his duties.

Sec. 78-34. - Signs required.

The provisions of sections 78-32 and 78-33 shall not be enforced on any street until that street has been posted with signs as required by S.C. Code 1976, § 56-5-720.

Sec. 78-35. - Stopping, standing, or parking prohibited in specified places; exceptions.

Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall:

- (1) Stop, stand or park a vehicle:
 - a. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
 - b. On a sidewalk;
 - c. Within an intersection;
 - d. On a crosswalk;
 - e. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
 - f. On roadway where no on-street parking is provided; or
 - g. At any place where official traffic control devices prohibit stopping.
- (2) Stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers:
 - a. In front of a public or private driveway;
 - b. Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
 - c. Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;
 - d. Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite any fire station within 75 feet of the entrance when properly signposted;
 - e. At any place where official traffic control devices prohibit standing; or
 - f. Within 20 feet of an intersection.
- (3) Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers:
 - a. At any place where official traffic control devices prohibit parking;
 - b. At any of the public beach access parking facilities between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., with the provision that specific exceptions may be granted by the council for emergency vehicles or others involved in public service functions, and further provided that this time restriction shall not apply to the Thistle Street public beach access;
 - c. For the purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale, advertising of any nature without proper authority or washing, greasing or repairing the vehicle except for emergency repairs.

Sec. 78-36. - Penalty for violations.

- (a) Any person who violates or fails to comply with the parking provisions of this section shall be fined \$50.00 for each offense, provided the fine is paid within 30 calendar days of the date of the citation. The fine shall then be increased to \$100.00 for each offense on the 31st calendar day after the date of the citation. Failure to pay the fine by the 60th day after the date of the citation shall result in the

issuance of a summons for court appearance with the fine to be in the discretion of the court but not to exceed \$200.00 for each offense.

- (b) Any person who violates or fails to comply with the provisions of section 78-33 shall be fined \$50.00 for each offense, provided the fine is paid within 30 calendar days of the date of this citation. The fine shall be increased to \$100.00 for each offense on the 31st calendar day after the date of the citation. Failure to pay the fine by the 60th calendar day after the date of the citation shall result in the issuance of a summons for court appearance with the fine to be in the discretion of the court but not to exceed \$200.00 for each offense.
- (c) Any person who violates or fails to comply with the provisions of section 78-35(1)a—f, (2)a, c—e shall be fined \$50.00 for each offense, provided the fine is paid within 30 calendar days of the date of the citation. The fine shall be increased to \$100.00 for each offense on the 31st calendar day after the date of the citation. Failure to pay the fine by the 60th calendar day after the date of the citation shall result in the issuance of a summons for court appearance with the fine to be in the discretion of the court but not to exceed \$200.00 for each offense. Any person who violates or fails to comply with section 78-35(2)b, parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, shall be fined \$75.00 for each offense provided the fine is paid within 30 calendar days of the date of the citation. The fine shall be increased to \$150.00 for each offense on the 31st calendar day after the date of the citation. Failure to pay the fine by the 60th calendar day shall result in the issuance of a summons for court appearance with the fine to be in the discretion of the court but not to exceed \$300.00 for each offense.

A Resolution

To Request the Tourism Expenditure Review Committee Grant Permission to the Town of Edisto Beach to Use Accommodations Tax Funds Acquired in Excess of Two Years Prior for Beach Renourishment

WHEREAS, the Town of Edisto Beach will undertake a spot beach renourishment due to damage from Hurricane Dorian in 2020/2021; and

WHEREAS, the Edisto Beach Chamber of Commerce estimates the beach and State Park receive over 440,000 vacationers and day visitors per year; and

WHEREAS, local businesses rely on the stability and beauty of the beach to attract vacationers and day visitors in order to provide income for said businesses; and

WHEREAS, local businesses contribute to the Accommodations Tax fund; and

WHEREAS, in order to acquire sufficient funds for the renourishment project, some funds may need to be held in excess of two years;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Edisto Beach, as duly assembled, formally requests the Tourism Expenditure Review Committee grant permission to the Town of Edisto Beach to use Accommodations Tax funds acquired in excess of two years prior for the purpose of the 2020/2021 spot beach renourishment project.
