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

The Pendleton Police Department has answered over 330 calls for service since January 1st which is down compared to 432 calls for service in 2019 and 550 calls for service over the same time period in 2018.

There were 5 reports taken in February, 80 warnings, and 18 state citations were issued.



I attended the monthly area detectives meeting in Seneca. A group of people from the Lowcountry has been targeting the larger banks in the area in a fraud scheme and hit banks in our area. However, none of the banks preyed upon are in Town limits.

I attended the monthly county police chief's meeting. We heard from Adam Westmoreland with the county concerning radios and coverage across the county. They have taken steps to reduce lack of coverage in certain areas. He also told us the system the county currently uses will be changed by 2025 and radios compatible to the new system will be required. This should not affect us as the Kenwood radios we currently use are compatible.

Officers Carpenter and Murray have completed their field training and began working a shift together. Cpl. Marano has moved to days. This provides two officers for each shift covered by the Town.

WHEREAS, Section 5-7-170 of the SC Code of Laws 1976, provides the authority for determining the salary of the Mayor and council and repayment of their expenses; and,

WHEREAS, Section 5-7-170 of the SC Code of Laws 1976, further provides that an ordinance establishing or increasing such salaries shall not become effective until the commencement date of the terms of two or more members elected at the next general election following the adoption of the Ordinance, at which time it will become effective for all members whether or not they were elected in such election; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Pendleton's next general election is Tuesday, November 2, 2021, with the seats for the office of the Mayor, Town Council Ward 1 and Town Council Ward 3 being open for election for terms commencing on December 1, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, the annual salaries for the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Pendleton, SC have not been adjusted since 2005; and,

WHEREAS, the current annual salary of the Mayor is six thousand dollars (\$6,000) and the current annual salary of town council is three thousand (\$3,000); and,

WHEREAS, currently, the Mayor is the only official participating in the Town's health insurance and retirement plan, and the Town desires to extend these two plans to both Mayor and Town Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of Pendleton, South Carolina, in council duly assembled, that;

Section 1. The annual salary of the Mayor shall be ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), the annual salary for Mayor pro-tem shall be eight thousand dollars (\$8,000), and the annual salary of each council member shall be seven thousand dollars (\$7,000).

Section 2. The Mayor and Town Council members shall be allowed to participate in the Town's health insurance program and retirement plan, per the Town's Personnel Manual, and to participate in the Town's health insurance program, they must be members of the retirement plan. The Mayor and Town Council members shall be responsible for 100 percent of any dependent coverage for health insurance. The Town reserves the right to change or modify its health insurance program from time to time, and continue coverage as is available under the health insurance program as modified from time to time.

The town has been working with Jack Ward since Oct. 2014 to get the lot and building cleaned up or removed. Until the town adopted the IPMC we didn't really have the tools to enforce the code on cleanup of property in town limits.

We sent Mr. Ward letters by certified and regular mail on 9/17/2019, advising him that the structure is unsafe. The letters were the standard letter that we send all property owners and provided dates for him to file an appeal and to clean up or demolish the property. Mr. Ward signed for the certified letters but did not respond to us. The time for him to file an appeal expired on 10/7/2019. The 60-day deadline to demolish or repair the property passed on 11/18/2019. The property was posted on 11/22/2019, Mr. Ward was notified by regular and certified mail that the Town would take action if the property was not cleaned up or demolished on or before 1/17/2020. He was also advised that a lien will be placed on the property if the Town has to demolish the unsafe structure. Mr. Ward signed for the second certified letter but did not respond.

Subsequently, beginning in December 2019, we solicited and received bids from four (4) contractors regarding the demolition of the property. Copies of the bids and all correspondence between the Town of Pendleton and Mr. Ward are attached.

As of 2/26/2020, we have not received any response from Mr. Ward. and there has been no activity at the property.

Should the Town be required to take such action a lien will be placed upon the property in accordance with Section 110.3 of the TPMC.

108.1.1 Unsafe structures.

An unsafe structure is one that is found to be dangerous to the life, health, property or safety of the public or the *occupants* of the structure by not providing minimum safeguards to protect or warn *occupants* in the event of fire, or because such structure contains unsafe equipment or is so damaged, decayed, dilapidated, structurally unsafe or of such faulty construction or unstable foundation, that partial or complete collapse is possible.

110.1 General.

The code official shall order the owner or owner's authorized agent of any premises upon which is located any structure, which in the code official's or owner's authorized agent judgment after review is so deteriorated or dilapidated or has become so out of repair as to be dangerous, unsafe, insanitary or otherwise unfit for human habitation or occupancy, and such that it is unreasonable to repair the structure, to demolish and remove such structure; or if such structure is capable of being made safe by repairs, to repair and make safe and sanitary, or to board up and hold for future repair or to demolish and remove at the owner's option; or where there has been a cessation of normal construction of any structure for a period of more than two years, the code official shall order the owner or owner's authorized agent to demolish and remove such structure, or board up until future repair. Boarding the building up for future repair shall not extend beyond one year, unless approved by the building official.

110.3 Failure to comply.


If the owner of a premises or owner's authorized agent fails to comply with a demolition order within the time prescribed, the code official shall cause the structure to be demolished and removed, either through an available public agency or by contract or arrangement with private persons, and the cost of such demolition and removal shall be charged against the real estate upon which the structure is located and shall be a lien upon such real estate.

[A] 111.1 Application for appeal.

Any person directly affected by a decision of the *code official* or a notice or order issued under this code shall have the right to appeal to the board of appeals, provided that a written application for appeal is filed within 20 days after the day the decision, notice or order was served. An application for appeal shall be based on a claim that the true intent of this code or the rules legally adopted there under have been incorrectly interpreted, the provisions of this code do not fully apply, or the requirements of this code are adequately satisfied by other means.


