Public charge: The Hillsborough Historic District Commission pledges to the citizens of Hillsborough its respect. - A. Certificate of Appropriateness Application: 137 N. Churton St. Applicant Town of Hillsborough requests approval to place a backflow preventer in the front of the building screened by landscaping at 137 N. Churton Street (PIN: 9874-06-4715).
- B. Certificate of Appropriateness Application: 320 N. Cameron St. Applicant Douglas Ray McArthur requests approval to build an 18'x24' addition onto an existing garage at 320 N. Cameron St. (PIN: 9874-18-5006).

Tryon St. Applicant Dana Cunningham requests approval to convert an existing carport into a screened porch, construct a brick wall, construct a 24'x24' concrete parking pad, relocate the existing gravel driveway to the east of the lot, extend a front stoop, construct a 10.5'x22' rear deck with steps, and to replace existing rear window openings with patio doors and replacement windows at 311 W. Tryon St. (PIN: 9864-86-4796).
- E. Certificate of Appropriateness Application: 208 N. Occoneechee St. Applicants Phillip and Annette Harris request approval to construct a new wood frame, brick foundation 2,929 square foot, 2-story house with walkout basement and single car garage, a 365 square foot front porch, 200 square foot rear deck, 17.5 square foot stoop, and a gravel wrap-around driveway on the vacant lot at 208 North Occoneechee St. (PIN: 9864-77-9188).

Public Comment – Written

(for items not on the agenda, agenda items and public hearings)

Members of the public may provide written public comment by submitting it via the Historic District Commission contact form by noon on the afternoon of the meeting.

When submitting the comment, include the following:

- The date of the meeting
- The agenda item (example: 5C) you wish to comment on
- Your name, address, email and phone number

Members of the Historic District Commission and Town staff will be copied on all comments submitted.

Public Comment – Verbal

(for items not on the agenda, agenda items and public hearings)

Members of the public will be asked to contact town staff using the <u>contact form</u> no later than noon on the day of the meeting and indicate they wish to speak during the meeting.

When submitting the request to speak, include the following:

- The date of the meeting
- The agenda item (example: 5C) you wish to speak on
- Your name, address, email and phone number
- The phone number must be the number you plan to call in from if participating by phone

Prior to the meeting, speakers will be emailed a Zoom participant link to be able to make comments during the live meeting. Speakers may use a computer (with camera and/or microphone) or phone to make comments.

Speakers using the phone for comments must use the provided PIN/Password number.

The public speaker's audio and video will be muted until the board gets to the respective agenda item(s). Individuals who have pre-registered will then be brought into the public portion of the meeting one at a time.
