9. Consideration of Agreement with Troy Davis to Waive Weed Mowing Assessment and Interest (\$5,600) for Private Residence at 724 Marlee Drive (unpaid City taxes of \$4,004.87 will be recovered and City will avoid cost of eventual demolition). View

- 10. Consideration of FY 2018-19 Master Services Agreement with Aetna Life Insurance and Telemedicine Services (effective July 1, 2018): <u>View</u>
 - Employee Group Health Insurance reduces fixed administrative fees by more than 50%; guarantees administrative fee rate for three (3) years; guarantees claims will not increase more than 10.1% compared to FY 2017-18 claims (estimates worst case cost increase of no more than 5.3% for 2018-19; claims estimated @ no more than \$10.55M); and
 - Telemedicine Services (Teledoc):
 - 1. Option 1: City pays administrative fees of \$0.20 per member per month, plus \$3 administrative fee for each actual Teladoc consultation; or
 - 2. Option 2: City pays administrative fees of \$0.95 per member per month, with no additional fees for consultations

Recommended Action: 1) Authorize the Mayor and City Manager to Execute Master Services Agreement on Behalf of the City; and

2) Authorize Utilization of Telemedicine Services (Option 1).

Consideration of Contract with The Kercher Group, Inc. for Consulting Services Relative to Pavement Condition Survey (scope of services to include physical assessment/analysis of all 283 miles of city-maintained streets using the Long-Term Pavement Performance (LTPP) PCS method recommended by the Federal Highway Administration; evaluation of data; funding analysis and recommendation for 10-year pavement maintenance plan \$95,430).
