Councilman Woodard made a motion, which was seconded by Councilmember member Bynum, that Council vote to carefully and respectfully move the Confederate statue located in the Tarboro Town Common into storage until a more suitable location is found.

Councilman Jenkins made a substitute motion, which was seconded by Councilman Mayo that Council postpone any action until a committee is formed, composed of four members and lead by the Town Attorney to further discuss the movement of the Confederate monument. The motion died based on a 2 to 6 vote. Councilmembers Jenkins and Mayo voted for the motion. Councilmembers Woodard, Jordan, Taylor, Bynum, Burnette and Brown voted against the motion.

Councilman Woodard's original motion to move the Confederate monument was passed by a 5 to 3 vote. Councilmembers Woodard, Jordan, Taylor, Bynum and Burnette voted for the motion. Councilmembers Jenkins, Mayo and Brown voted against the motion.

(4) ESFRLP-19 Contract for Rehabilitation

Council voted to award contracts to Evans Custom Builders and Strickland Construction and that those contracts be executed by the Town Manager. John Jenkins made a motion, which was seconded by Deborah Jordan and Passed, Motion.

Councilmember Jordan - stated that she appreciates the votes to remove the Confederate monument. She also thanked the Police Department for addressing her concerns and the Electric Department for recently offering mutual aid following storm damage.

Councilman Jenkins - expressed appreciation to citizens and Councilmembers that spoke regarding the Confederate monument.

Councilmember Bynum - expressed appreciation to Council for working through a tough situation.

Councilman Burnette - none.

Councilman Brown - stated that he was proud of Council and highlighted positive things happening in Tarboro including the shell building and sidewalk repairs. He also thanked the Electric Department Tree Crew for being proactive before the recent storm which reduced power outages.

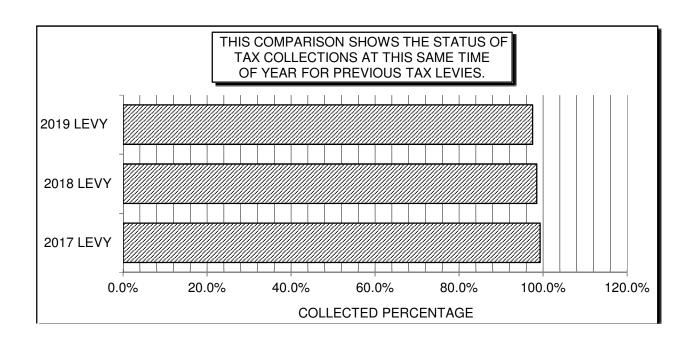
